Remembering the Faithful Departed

During the month of November the Sunday Mass readings turn our attention toward the last things: death, judgment, heaven, hell, and purgatory. In addition to reminding us of our own need to live in readiness for the Lord's coming, November is a time to remember those who have gone before us in faith. We usually call them the faithfully departed or the Holy Souls in Purgatory.

Those in Purgatory are assured of salvation because they died in friendship with God; however, their friendship is not yet perfected. They are being purified by God's merciful love from any lingering attachment to sin. Our prayers and sacrifices on their behalf can accelerate this process and speed their entry into Heaven.

During the month of November our parish Book of the Deceased will be placed in the church foyer, and you are invited to inscribe the names of your deceased loved ones, especially those who have died in the last year. Beginning the week of November 6 (following Deacon Justin Hamilton's priesthood ordination), we will again have the Wall of Remembrance on which you are invited to place a picture of your loved ones. Both of these will help remind us of those for whom we are praying during the month of November.

May the souls of all the faithful departed, through the mercy of God, rest in peace. Amen.

Please pray that I will be a wise and humble priest after the heart of St. John Vianney.



Convocation, Part II

As discussed last week, certain key member's of our parish staff attended a convocation at Savior Pastoral Center a few weeks back. The convocation came on the heels of a much larger national convocation which was held in Florida a few months back, which came in response to a petition from Pope Francis to the US. During our convocation there were a series of really tough questions raised and one of them was raised to Fr. Nick Blaha. The question was "how should the Church handle the reality of divorce and remarriage as it pertains to Holy Communion?" And the answer Fr. Blaha gave was beautiful. He told a story from the life of St. Augustine. Apparently at the end of his life, St. Augustine began to abstain from Holy Communion for two reasons. To enter into solidarity with the members of his flock living in sin who could not receive, while also intensifying his desire for eternal life. He once stated that he wanted to die hungry. Remarkable. Fr. Blaha concluded that the way forward with divorced and remarried Catholics who have yet to obtain a decree of nullity, is to encounter, accompany, to demonstrate compassion, but without ever compromising the truth. I completely agree. Whatever the way forward in the New Evangelization, it must involve mercy, but without compromising the truth. Far better to die hungry, living in the truth, than to commit sacrilege and die in sin.




We are still seeking Volunteers

A Prayer for the Faithful Departed




“HUMANAE VITAE 50 YEARS LATER”
